5:05 Start meeting — David leading

5:06 David, Ross, Paul, Dick introductions

5:08 Mickey, Ellen, Jim introductions

5:10 David gives full disclosure of knowledge of Daileys as he leads the meeting.

5:11 David explaining the email and explaining the HOA policies

5:12 Clarification on landscaping/siding

5:13 Questions about clarification on landscaping easement agreement

5:14 Jim and Ellen agreed when David said no piling rocks. David suggests an email that clarifies

5:14 Dick states to be cautious about legal issues about crossing property lines, states financial concerns, legal concerns

ACC would generally agree but being cautious

- 5:19 David talks about his experience with easement around a concrete pad.
- 5:20 Paul once again says get a document from Norm
- 5:21 David says move on to second item. Rusted patina corrugated siding
- 5:22 Jim asks for guidance from the board for what materials are available. States there is a problem of water with the garage and foundation. Settling is an issue.
- 5:23 Paul is attempting to answer. States he update the guidelines. Maintaining the character of the mountain community. Cedar siding exclusive and horizontal. Over years we have evolved and allowed stone. Hardiplank around the corner. Colors are important for roofing and siding.
- 5:25 Paul one of the concerns he has is difference between mining and mountain community. States rusted corrugated metal is with the mining communities. Second issue is how we manage expansion.
- 5:26 Metal can be accommodated and the color can be fine. Talks about corrugated distracting from the feel of the mountain community. With metal or hardiplank, that we can find acceptable.
- 5:27 Ross clarifies to comment about metal options
- 5:27 Jim actions about goals of ACC. Modern or conservation goal.
- 5:28 Paul and Dick comment about the corrugated metal.
- 5:28 Dick talks about the history of the ACC at the beginning. Board history about symmetry of homes. Progress.
- 5:30 David likes synthetic, metal, hardiboard. Gives his opinion about look book. Against multitude rusted patina
- 5:32 Mickey talks about the concerns. Limiting the amount of rusted siding used as an option. The color on 8th avenue. People put up cold rolled steel siding, don't clean it, the oil protects it and then rusts inconsistently. No muriatic acid. Talks about color consistency.
- 5:35 Paint coating that looks like rust. Baked on finish that is consistent. Cold rolled is cost effective.
- 5:36 Compared to log homes. Made homes look victorian. Context of materials. Gives examples of other communities.
- 5:37 Paul responds about consistancy once again. Changes that are allowed now and things have changed.
- 5:38 David says final review application. Rusted metal patina has been excluded. Majority is not acceptable
- 5:40 option to petition to the entire board, or submit additional design samples. Follow the policy of the ACC.

- 5:42 Dick talks about history of board appeals. History of neighbors and aesthetics. Community is the focus.

- 5:44 Paul responds with the corrugated steel reaction. Jim does not like synthetic stone. Recognizes peoples opinions.
- 5:45 Ross offers hardiplank, Mickey responds that it's not as durable as metal.
- 5:45 Mickey asks for options on metal. Paul suggests to come up with 3 examples to compare rather than a description
- 5:46 Jim asks anything acceptable? David says monotone colors is more

acceptable than multiline. The last two pages of the document have some acceptable options.

5:48 Mickey describes some options. Coated finishes. Horizontal panels are painted maybe.
